Sometimes we are willing to experience something hard because there is gain on the other side for ourselves or someone we love! This summer my family took a trip to the beach, and we experienced something new, different and for sure uncomfortable. About an hour outside of our destination our car broke down. It was beyond immediate repair. To make a long story short, despite not having a car and being in such a small town that we couldn't rent one or have a company take us, we were determined to make it to the beach. We spent hours trying to get the car fixed, followed by more hours trying to get a ride there. The sun was hot, our tummies were hungry, and we were all frustrated and tired. Let's look together at a place in scripture where Jesus came to the world – even though it was a world of darkness – so that we, his children, could experience eternal life with him. John chapter one starts out with several parallels to creation by first stating, “In the beginning was the Word.” The Word was already there in the beginning. This “Word” is not a literal word but a man. The Word who was also God took on humanity. The holy son of God took on human form and lived on earth. Talk about different and for sure uncomfortable!

We are told that John came to bear witness to the light. Jesus was the light, life and truth.

Scripture describes Jesus as the true light that gives life to everyone. This light shows the very presence of God. So, do you find yourself asking why? This question is answered for us in verse 12 – “But to all who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.” He did it for you and me. We are saved through Christ alone!
